The program is currently serving 20 interns during the period of September 1, 2017 through August 31, 2018. O'ahu college students are from Leeward Community College (LCC), Kapi'olani Community College (KCC), Honolulu Community College (HonCC), and University of Hawaii at Manoa. Maui, Moloka'i and Lana'i college students attend the University of Hawaii at Maui College (UHMC). High Schools participants are from Kamehameha Schools Maui and Kapalama Campus on O'ahu. Hawaii Island college students attend the University of Hawaii at Hilo.
