



Coastal and Upland Wetland Restoration of Kahoolawe, HI (NAWCA U.S. Small Grants)

BACKGROUND

The purpose of this project is to enhance the temporary wetland sites at Keanakeiki and Lua ‘O Kealialalo through the removal of invasive plants and out planting of natives. Activities are to be completed in partnership with the Maui Nui Seabird Recovery Project, the Protect Kaho’olawe ‘Ohana Education Committee and KIRC community volunteers. Period of Performance runs from 2021-2023.

DELIVERABLES

- Remove invasive species
- Out plant native species
- Monitor through photo points
