



CULTURE PROGRAM STATUS UPDATE JUNE - OCTOBER 2013

Pōkāneloa Stone

The draft site stabilization plan has been completed and is awaiting KIRC approval. The plan suggests that the area immediately surrounding the stone will be stabilized and the efforts of erosion control and stabilization reassessed in November of 2014 in order to determine whether the stone feature will be relocated or not.

Prior to the approval of the site stabilization plan, implementation of erosion controls has begun upstream of Site 110 (the site at which Pōkāneloa rests).

HUI KĀPEHE PAID COLLEGE INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES: SPRING 2014

The Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission (KIRC) is proud to announce that its **Hui Kāpehe Program** has been selected as one of seven national grant program recipients through the **Native Hawaiian Career and Technical Education program (NHCTEP)**, in partnership with **Alu Like Inc.**

The KIRC's Hui Kāpehe college internship program offers work-related experience, community service learning, and job shadowing opportunities related to career and technical education (CTE) focusing on sustainability and Hawaiian culture. 30 students of Native Hawaiian descent will be accepted for intensive internships in one of KIRC's core program areas: Operations, Ocean, Restoration, Culture and Administration.

Program Offerings

Only 30 students will be accepted into Hui Kāpehe each semester. Paid certification training and/or educational assistance for Native Hawaiian students who fulfill all program requirements. 300 hours paid internship for Native Hawaiian students with the Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission in one of five (5) program areas: Operations, Ocean, Restoration, Culture and Administration.

Program Requirements

1. Mandatory program meeting (TBD)
2. Academic promise letter - signed
3. Minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA preferred
4. Priority given to those enrolled in at least 12 credits per semester
5. Priority given to second year students in a CTE program certification track, and/or pursuing a two year degree
6. 300 hours of program relevant training prior to internship (include one approved Alu Like College course, based on KIRC website)

Honoreables (Student Responsibilities)

1. Attend classes on a regular basis
2. Maintain regular contact with the Hui Kāpehe program staff (e.g. return calls and/or emails within 3 business days; notify program staff of address and/or telephone number changes; attend all scheduled office visits at least twice a semester)
3. Consult with the Hui Kāpehe Committee before dropping or withdrawing from any courses, and/or changing to part-time status or withdrawing from school activities
4. Attend mandatory program orientations and activities
5. Participate in one major fundraising event during the year by selling lemons
