



1. RESTORATION SUMMARY

April 2014

Restoration Activities:

During the month of April the Restoration team lead 44 volunteers to Kaho'olawe. Groups that went to island included Maui Nui Botanical Garden, Kekaulike High School's Kaiapuni Hawaiian Language students and KUPU's AMERICORP. A total of 4,300 native plants were planted in the rock/mulch mounds within the DOH III work area.

Lyman purchased a solar water pump for the DOH III project. He is pre-assembling the solar panel frames and other components for the pump system. The pre-assembled system will be shipped to island.

Jamie and Paul attended the first Kaho'olawe Seabird Restoration Project Steering Committee meeting in Honolulu. The KIRC is working with Island Conservation in developing a business plan for the removal of all invasive invertebrates from Kaho'olawe.

Lopaka assisted with the driving and maintenance of the 'Ohua.
