Grant Project:	Photovoltaic Energy for Kaho'olawe Base Camp
Source:	Maui County OED
Amount:	\$25,000
Term:	April 2014 — March 2015
Description	The KIRC will work with Rising Sun Solar Electric, LLC to build a second PV system that will power Base Camp HUT 12, contributing to the long-term goal of converting all Kaho'olawe operations to green energy.



Grant Project:	Hui Kāpehe
Source:	Alu Like, Inc. Native Hawaiian Career and Technical Education Program in partnership with the U.S. Department of Education
Amount:	\$269,113
Term:	September 2014 — August 2015
Description	A paid college internship program preparing Native Hawaiians to be competitive in the workplace through rigorous and culturally-appropriate career and technical education programs.

Amount:	\$50,000
Term:	January — December 2015
Description	The project will continue to restore 2.5 acres of the 6.3 coastal land project area at Honokanai'a Bay. 5,000 native plants will be planted at Honokanai'a, with 500+ pounds of invasive fish removed.
