Subject: Request by the Protect Kaho‘olawe ‘Ohana to approve access dates and activities for 2027.

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

Pursuant to HAR §13-261-13 and Section 8 of the Palapala ‘Aelike Kahu‘āina, approve the proposed access dates and activities for the 2027 calendar year requested by the Protect Kaho‘olawe ‘Ohana (PKO) as KIRC approved and authorized activities.

BACKGROUND & SUMMARY:

At the July 13, 2012 Stewardship Working Group meeting and as reported at the August 10, 2012 Commission meeting, KIRC and PKO have agreed to use the following terminology:

- **Authorized Activities** – Activities permitted within the Reserve as specified in HRS 6K.
- **Stewardship Agreement Authorized Activities** – Activities approved in the Stewardship Agreement Section 2.
- **KIRC Approved and Authorized Activities** – Activities that have been formally approved by Commission action taken at a duly noticed public meeting as meeting the criteria of Section 8 of the Stewardship Agreement.

As approved at the February 16, 2012 Commission meeting and amended at the December 17, 2012 and February 16, 2017 Commission meetings, the following table is a summary of “KIRC Approved and Authorized Activities.” Continued approval of these activities is contingent upon satisfactory compliance with the coordination and reporting requirements as specified.

The Palapala ‘Aelike Kahu‘āina signed on June 13, 2019 and reaffirmed on June 26, 2024 amended Section 8 so that “volunteers acting in a KIRC approved capacity may be regarded as volunteers under chapter 90 HRS. The Department of the Attorney General has the sole authority to determine whether volunteers will receive representation from the Department of the Attorney General for purposes of chapter 662 HRS. Persons conducting only religious and spiritual activities, including but not limited to those listed in Section 6 of this agreement, might not be deemed volunteers for the purposes of Chapter 90, HRS, as each determination will be made on a case-by-case basis.”

There is no additional request to the list of KIRC Approved and Authorized Activities.

METHODS & DISCUSSION:

The attached PKO Huaka‘i schedule was forwarded to the KIRC for approval. Additional dates for Ala Loa and other projects may be submitted later and administratively approved by the KIRC Executive Director.

The activities listed in the PKO request (Table 1) are consistent with approved and authorized activities (Table 1).

LEGAL AUTHORITY:

Pursuant HRS §6K-6(1), the KIRC shall establish criteria, policies, and controls for permissible uses within the island reserve.

Pursuant HRS §6K-6(5), the KIRC may enter into curator or stewardship agreements with appropriate Hawaiian organizations such as the ‘Ohana.

Pursuant to HAR §13-261-13, the KIRC will allow activities for the preservation and practice of all rights customarily and traditionally exercised by native Hawaiians for cultural and subsistence purposes; allow activities which are educational, and which relate to native Hawaiian cultural practices or to the natural or cultural resources of The Reserve.
