Budget, Finance, and Funding

FY26 Expenditure Report and Budget Variance: See attached.

Variances:

1. Restoration Program is behind both in non-personnel and personnel spending due to the delayed award of the DOH 6 grant.
2. Culture Program is behind in personnel spending as the CRPC position was just filled in December 2025.
3. Ocean Program is ahead in personnel spending as the funding from the Maui County Green's Grant ended at the end of 2025.

Plans, Policies and Procedures

Long-range Scheduling: See the attached long-range schedule.

Highlights: March 2026 and June 2026 access schedules will primarily focus on completing the mua in Honokanai'a.

Administration, Staffing and Personnel

Commissioner Status Update: Commissioner Pescaia's current term expired on June 30, 2025, but she is still able to serve as a holdover until the end of the 2026 legislative session. The Boards and Commissions Office has been notified of Commissioner Pescaia's intention to not seek an additional term and that the Protect Kaho'olawe 'Ohana (PKO) will be nominating a replacement.

The PKO has been notified to submit a letter to the Boards and Commissions office with their recommendation for replacement and for the individual to apply on-line for the position.

KIRC Staff Status Update:

New Hire for Cultural Resources Project Coordinator: Leiokeko'olani Brown was hired as Cultural Resources Project Coordinator (CRPC) and started on December 29, 2025.

Selection for Logistic Specialist position: KIRC staff has hired Ocean Resource Specialist II (ORS II) Christina Wine for the position of Logistics Specialist. Her start date is pending completion of her hiring paperwork.

Public Information, Outreach and Government Relations

Legislative Update: See attached legislative matrix. The only bills relating to Kaho'olawe so far include the State Budget bills which continues KIRC funding at the current level and a House and Senate District CIP requests supporting the KIRC's CIP request of \$4.25M for Phase 2 of the Kīhei Restoration and Resilience Center submitted by Senator McKelvey and Representative Amato. Lastly, only one of the PKO's special license plate bill from 2025 was carried over to the 2026 session.

Meeting with Maui Council Committee on Agriculture, Diversification, Environment and Public Transportation (ADEPT): The KIRC ED participated in a January 30, 2026, Maui County Council ADEPT hearing as a resource specialist to brief the members on an upcoming ADEPT Limited Hearing being planned for February 12, 2026, on Kaho'olawe. The purpose of this visit is to brief the members on the current state of the Kaho'olawe restoration effort as part of Maui County's overall strategic goals, to demonstrate the various restoration techniques used in the field, view past restoration efforts on island and to introduce the KIRC's portion of the Na'ulu Cloud Bridge Restoration Project under consideration for Maui County funding.

Capital Improvement, Reserve Operations and Logistics

Update on Base Camp Capital Improvement Project: Currently Dawson has four tasks under this project:

Task 1: Roof repairs and elastomeric coating: This project was completed in April 2025.

Task 2: Replace potable water distribution system: All the materials are on island. So far, the old shower trailer was disconnected and removed, old potable water distribution lines were removed from the reverse osmosis unit and new main distribution lines were installed.

Task 3: Install AC units: Both split systems were installed and tested during the September 2025 access. The air handler unit was moved into the KIRC staff hut for better airflow in the building. This task is complete.

Task 4: Building painting: The paint was received and was able to be shipped to base camp during the January 2026 access. The initial plan was to start painting during the access, but weather conditions delayed that option. The current plan is to start painting during the upcoming February 2026 access.

Task 5: Transformer Replacement. This is a new task to use the remaining CIP funds in this appropriation. Five base camp transformers will be replaced due to end-of-life cycle and extreme weathering. All are 3-phase, 480V transformers rated between 74 and 150 KVA.

Task 6: Gutter and Water Storage. This is another new task utilizing the contingency funding remaining in the contract. Gutters will be installed on Huts 10 and 14 and runoff directed into two, on-island 2,500 gallon tanks.

Update on Kihei Boathouse Expansion: A professional services contract was awarded to GHD Architects to begin the design and planning effort to expand the current Kihei Boathouse and build an adjacent pavilion and comfort station. NOAA granted KIRC \$1,000,000 for the initial portion of this project.

New Honokanai'a Water Catchment Project: DLNR's Office of Conservation and Coastal Lands (OCCL) has authorized another \$150,000 in special funding for the KIRC's coastal restoration efforts on Kaho'olawe. A portion of this funding will be used to build a 60'x 24' water catchment and storage tank in the Honokanai'a Base Camp to collect and store water for coastal irrigation projects. The catchment will serve a double purpose. By being built over the

existing fuel storage and transfer station in camp, it will create a covered storage area to stage vehicles between island accesses, protect the fueling equipment from sun and weather damage and create a covered area to refuel and conduct basic maintenance on small vehicles. Staff are currently in the process of issuing a procurement solicitation for this project.
