



Shoreline Revegetation to Protect Kaho'olawe Coastal Habitat (U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services Grant)

BACKGROUND

The goals and objectives of this community-based project are to enhance two acres of shoreline by removing invasive grasses and planting hardy, native plant seedlings in the Kealaikahiki 'ili. These actions will decrease shoreline erosion and increase habitat for federally protected species. **Grant Life: Oct. 2025-Sept. 2027.**

DELIVERABLES

- Directly enhance two acres of coastal shoreline in the Kealaikahiki 'ili by removing invasive alien plants, reintroducing native plants.

AWARD AMOUNT: \$49,500
