

County of Maui Greens Grant Program (Greens Grant)

BACKGROUND

The proposed project will enhance 2.69 acres of a seasonal mixed palustrine emergent and scrubshrub coastal wetland habitat located in Honokanai'a and 1.5 acres of wetland habitat in Honukanaenae in the 'ili of Kealaikahiki on the southwestern end of Kaho'olawe. The overall mission of this project is to restore wetlands and stabilize sand dunes on the coastline of Kealaikahiki 'ili by introducing native vegetation (8,000 native plants), removing invasive alien species, and constructing of waterflow control devices and sediment traps across the 1.75 acres of road. **Grant Life: January 2025-December 2025.**

DELIVERABLES

• Directly enhance 2.69 acres of palustrine emergent and scrub-shrub coastal wetland habitat in Kealaikahiki 'Ili by removing invasive alien plants, reintroducing native plants in the efforts to reduce siltation within 12 months of the project start date.
